2021 Fair Catalog- General Livestock Rules

1. Scott County Fair will not be responsible in case of fire, accident or providential destruction; however, every precaution will be made to safeguard the stock and eliminate any danger or mistakes in the show ring. We will not be responsible for injuries to individuals.
2. Judges decisions are final.
3. Livestock Superintendents reserve the right to prohibit the exhibition or display for sale of any animal that is sick, diseased or not deemed in the best interest of the promotion of the animal and/or industry. These animals must be removed from the grounds.
4. Out of county livestock exhibitors will pay a \$5 registration fee per exhibitor to show. Poultry and Rabbit exhibitors will pay a \$3 registration fee to show.
5. All Scott County 4-H/FFA/Youth projects entered **must** have registration certificate or proof of declaration in the name of exhibitor or letters showing that registration papers are pending. Papers **MUST** be presented for breeding animals. Market animals must be Kentucky Uniform Identification Program (KUIP) tagged. All youth livestock must be registered in the exhibitor's name.
6. All animals must be shown by the 4-H or FFA exhibitor (owner) unless the exhibitor is incapacitated (deprived of strength or ability; physically impaired) or has more than one entry in a class, then he/she may have another 4-H or FFA youth exhibit his/her animal.
7. All exhibitors must show in appropriate attire, animals must be broke and easy to handle, and intact males may not be used for showmanship classes.
8. Exhibitor age is determined as of January 1st of the current year. Exhibitors between ages 5-8 are eligible to participate in Novice classes.
9. Novice (ages 5-8) will receive participation awards **ONLY** and are limited to one market animal.
10. **Health Requirements:** Must have current KY State Health Certificate. Horses must also have a current negative Coggins certificate.
11. All livestock/animals offered for sale or exhibition at Kentucky County Fairs shall meet the following regulations according to KRS Chapter 257:
 - a. 302 KAR 20:040 (Entry into Kentucky)
 - b. 302 KAR 20:065 (Sale and Exhibition of Kentucky Origin Livestock)Any questions concerning these health regulations should be directed to your local veterinarian or the Kentucky State Veterinarian's Office at 502-782-5901. Please be advised that Livestock Health Regulations are subject to change any time.
12. Individual animal can be shown as either Market or Breeding animal whichever it is deemed day of show. It cannot be shown in both classes.
13. All 4-H & FFA Members are eligible for Open Class & all exhibitors will show together.
14. **ONLY** Scott County 4-H (Enrolled in the Livestock, Poultry, or Rabbit Program) & FFA exhibitors will receive the additional one time premiums per species of \$15.00.
15. A Scott County Champion and Reserve Champion will be selected for 4-H and FFA.
16. Only first place animals are eligible for Championship drive. When the Champion is selected, the second place winner from that class will be brought back for Reserve Champion.
17. 5 or more animals of a breed must be present for a breed show. Less than 5 head will go into the AOB (All Other Breeds) class.
18. All market animals will be weighed & divided into classes according to weights by the livestock committee.
19. Single entries will receive a fourth place premium (\$10).

1. Feeders must be born on or after September 1, 2020 and weigh between 350-700 lbs.
2. All feeder calves must be dehorned (no horns or scurs) and castrated (no testicular tissue) before May 1, 2021. If testicular tissue or horns/scurs are present the animal will not be eligible for exhibit at the Fair.
3. Feeder calves may either be heifers or castrated males (steers).
4. Dairy and Beef feeders will be shown separately and will be assigned to the proper weight classes following weigh-in. There will be a maximum of 10 feeder calves per class.
5. Feeders must be halter broke, easy to handle, and must be shown with a halter.
6. Both beef and dairy feeders may be crossbred from recognized foundation breeds. No mix between dairy and beef breeds is permitted.

8. All youth exhibitors must handle their own rabbits.
9. Class will be called three times and three times only.
10. 4-H classes are limited to youth currently enrolled in a KY 4H rabbit project.
11. Maximum of 5 rabbit entries.
12. Crossbred Class Winners cannot compete in best in show.

1. To enter exhibits you must come to the County Fair Exhibit Hall on Monday, June 21st 5:00pm – 6:00pm or Tuesday June 22nd 8:00am – 11:00am.
2. Entries will be judged on Tuesday at 11:00 am.
3. Entries shall be made by current and active FFA members in Scott County (Scott County FFA, Great Crossing FFA, Royal Spring FFA)
4. Only one entry per member per class in each contest division is permitted.
5. All exhibits must be properly labeled to be considered for premiums. Labels are to include name of item, student's name and chapter. (Labels will be available at the fair. However, chapters are encouraged to have labels prepared when they arrive at the fair.)
6. Entries will be released between 9:00 and 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, June 26th, 2021.

Contest Divisions

Agriculture Mechanics

Division Rules:

1. Entries shall be made by FFA members in Scott County.
2. Entries must have been constructed under supervision of the contestant's teacher of agriculture.
3. Each entry must have been constructed after July 1, 2020.

Division Rules- Landscape Design Display:

1. The display should consist of a scale model of a home, trees, shrubs, walks, patios, etc. The scale model must be constructed on a hard surface of four square feet (2x2) or less. The landscape design will count 40 percent in the judging.
2. Individual landscape entries cannot be attached to other entries.
3. A landscape design plan drawn to scale and the same size as the model must accompany the display.
 - a. Label all pertinent components on the plan, including walks, drives, picnic tables, ponds, etc.
 - b. Put the "Key" of plant components directly on the plan page (not on a separate sheet).
 - c. The landscape design plan will count 60% in the judging.
4. Entries will be classified as Excellent (blue), Good (red), or Fair (white).
5. Premiums- \$100.00 awarded in Danish System: Blue – 3x, Red – 2x and White – 1x. Maximum gift \$10.00 for Blue Ribbon.

Division Rules- Potted Flowers/Plants:

1. Exhibits shall consist of one or more plants individually potted.
2. Plants must be labeled – include name of plant, student's name and chapter name.
3. Potted plants must be grown by the student exhibiting the plant.
4. The plants and pots should be "touched-up" before they are exhibited.
5. Entries will be classified as Excellent (blue), Good (red), or Fair (white).
6. Premiums: Danish System: Blue – 3x, Red – 2x, White – 1x. Limited \$3.00 for Blue award.

4. FFA Premiums: \$350 allotted on Danish System. Blue – 3x, Red- 2x, White – 1x. Limit of \$3 for top award with the exception of the General Collection (class 50) - Premiums: \$10, \$5 and \$3.
